COUNCILS CALL TIME ON TOURISTS BEHAVING BADLY

● In Palma you can be fined for not “covering-up,” in Ibiza you could face a penalty for shouting and Calvia is planning a crackdown on bad behaviour in Magalluf.

ENOUGH is enough. Local councils across the Balearics are calling on tourists to behave otherwise they risk a fine. Palma has already introduced “A good Citizen Plan” and tourists have been told to cover-up away from beach areas and German tourists will no longer be allowed to drink alcohol through a straw from a bucket. In San Antonio in Ibiza tourists can even be fined for shouting and “disturbing the peace” and Calvia is planning a big crackdown in Magalluf. The message is clear; Bad Behaviour Will No Longer Be Tolerated.” Other local councils are expected to introduce similar legislation.

Business groups fear the rise of the rebels

● Industry lobbyists fear the rise of protest parties and anti-EU rebels in European elections threaten to leave them, and the businesses they represent, out in the cold. Europeans frustrated by economic hardship are likely to vote to give one in four of the European Parliament’s 751 seats to eurosceptics and protest parties of both left and right. “There are going to be very vocal personalities ranting against the EU,” said Derk Jan Eppinck, a Dutch member of the current parliament that draws its members from 28 European countries from Sweden to Romania. “These groups are anti-globalisation. It’s contagious. This will be implanted in parliament. The end effect of this is anti-business,” he said.
