CORBYN'S BIG SPANISH ALLY

Palma.—Pablo Iglesias, the leader of Podemos, the Spanish anti-austerity and protest party which was formed from the anti- eviction movement, welcomed the appointment of new Labour leader Jeremy Corbyn yesterday saying that it was a step towards change in Europe. Iglesias, who has called for radical change in Spain, has

given his full backing to the Labour leader, whose parents met during a Republican protest march during the Spanish civil war.

Both Corbyn and Iglesias have a radical manifesto especially on Europe with the leader of Podemos calling for the power of German Chancellor Angela Merkel to be curbed. A vegetarian republican who only

received backing from fellow Labour lawmakers to enter the contest to ensure wide debate, Corbyn has struck a chord with many Labour supporters by repudiating the pro-business consensus of Tony Blair, who won three elections for Labour but is now widely unpopular, not least because of his involvement in the invasion of Iraq.

Podemos has enjoyed a spectacular rise in Spanish politics taking thousands of votes in the last local elections. They now have 10 members of the Balearic parliament and form part of the coalition Balearic government. They have also been big supporters of the former Greek Prime Minister Alexis Tsipras.
