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Turkey downs Russian warplane near Syria border

London.—Turkey shot down a Russian warplane near the Syrian border yesterday, saying it had repeatedly violated its air space, one of the most serious publicly acknowledged clashes between a NATO member country and Russia for half a century.

Russian President Vladimir Putin said the plane had been attacked when it was 1 km (0.62 mile) inside Syria and warned of “serious consequences” for what he termed a stab in the back administered by “the accomplices of terrorists.” **See Full Report on Page 8**

Hoteliers snubbed over the tourist tax
