PALMA'S PROHIBITION

● Ban on the sale of alcohol from midnight to 8a.m. in some parts of the city including the tourist resorts in the Playa de Palma.

Palma.—The Palma City Council announced plans for a ban on the sale of alcohol in some areas from shops, vending machines and street sellers between the hours of midnight to 8a.m. yesterday as

a part of a major crackdown. The legislation is similar to the one which already exists in Magalluf and the city council announced that the ban would be enforced in the following areas: Can Pastilla, El

Jonquet, Paseo Maritimo, Son Armadams and Plaza Gomila and Arenal. The council is supporting the move with fines of up to 3,000 euros for anyone caught selling alcohol between these hours other than

in licenced establishments. The move is expected to be welcomed by many residents in these areas. The council's get tough campaign is expected to be approved at a meeting this week.
