Cameron says bids for Tata UK “encouraging”

London.—iTata Steel’s has received an encouraging number of serious offers for its British assets Prime Minister David Cameron said yesterday but also said there were no guarantees of a successful conclusion.

Britain’s steel industry has been hit by cheap Chinese imports, high energy costs and a global supply glut. In March, Tata said it wanted to sell its loss-making operation in the country, putting 15,000 jobs at risk.

Tata’s decision has turned the spotlight on the global steel market and the impact of Chinese exports that could lead to protectionist trade policies.

Bookies say that Britain is on course to remain within the European Union

London.—Betting odds yesterday indicated an 82.6 per cent implied probability of Britain voting to stay in the European Union in a June 23 referendum, according to Betfair.

The implied probability of an “In” vote has increased by about 12 percentage points in the past week and a half, according to Betfair odds.

While odds have consistently indicated an In vote, opinion pollsters have so far painted contradictory pictures of how Britons will vote.
