NO alcohol on display

Calvia.—A proposal is to be presented to next week's council meeting in Calvia to improve the "aesthetic quality" of various establishments.

It is also aimed at stopping or at least minimising displays of alcoholic

drinks in the main commercial and tourist areas of the municipality which include Magalluf.

The town hall is therefore taking a further step in seeking to eradicate the "excesses of tourism" which have

existed over so many years. The proposal will be an amendment to a by-law of 2006 regarding the external aesthetics of establishments. In addition to addressing displays of alcoholic drink, the amended bylaw will

tackle noise pollution caused by recreational machines. This has in mind machines such as "kicker", "kick boxer" and "arm wrestler". The revised ordinance would ban them from terraces and from bars themselves.



LONDON ATTACKER WAS CRIMINAL WHO WASN'T SEEN AS SECURITY THREAT

London.—Before he killed at least four people in Britain's deadliest attack since the 2005 London bombings, Khalid Masood was considered by intelligence officers to be a criminal who posed little serious threat.

A British-born convert to Islam, Masood had shown up on the periphery of previous terrorism investigations that brought him to the attention of Britain's MI5 spy agency.

But the 52-year-old was not under investigation when he sped across Westminster Bridge on Wednesday, ploughing down pedestrians with a hired car before running into the parliamentary grounds and fatally stabbing an unarmed policeman.

He was shot dead by police.
