● The election outcome gives Britons in Spain hope for “a less dogmatic Brexit and a less aggressive stance by the U.K.” in the negotiations.


MAY FIGHTS FOR SURVIVAL

● The EuroCitizens association in Spain, which demands continuing rights after Brexit for British citizens there and for Spanish nationals in the U.K., says the election outcome gives it hope for “a less dogmatic Brexit and a less aggressive stance by the U.K.” in the negotiations.

Spanish prime minister Mariano Rajoy has said in a message to May he wants to deepen ties with the U.K., especially their cooperation in the fight against terror attacks, and help ensure an “orderly” departure for the U.K. from the European Union.

However, Rajoy could perhaps find himself dealing with a new leader should Theresa May be replaced which was one of the top stories yesterday.
