Illegal immigrant boats arrive in Majorca

PALMA. Two illegal immigrant “patera” boats were found by the Guardia Civil yesterday morning.

One was in Cala Llobards in Santanyi, the other in Cala Pi in Lluçmajor. Twelve people from the Cala Llobards were picked up, three of them minors. The boat was taken to nearby Cala Figuera.

From the Cala Pi boat there were eighteen detentions, six of them minors. Two other boats were intercepted by the Guardia - one by Cala S’Estanyol in Santa

Eulalia, Ibiza, and a second that had landed at Playa Migjorn in Formentera. There were two people on the Formentera boat. Police were hunting for the people from the boat that had arrived in Ibiza.

So far this year there have been twelve illegal immigrant boats, eight of them in Majorca (including Cabrera), with a total of 104 people.

Last year there were 23 boats with 267 people. The illegal immigrants are normally from Algeria.
