British airline blames Brexit for drop in demand for tickets

London.—EasyJet warned yesterday that customer demand for ticket sales for the next six months - which includes the peak summer season - is unexpectedly weak.

The airline blamed uncertainty over the global economy and Brexit for the slowdown in forward bookings.

As a result, EasyJet said it was now more

cautious over its outlook for the second half of its financial year. The airline has already said it expects to make a loss of around £275m for the first half of the year.

EasyJet's shares fell almost eight percent in early trading following the release of its trading update, which had originally been due for release on Friday.
