30,000 people visited the Palma Boat Show

Palma.—The Palma International Boat Show finished on Wednesday. Over 30,000 went to the show and exceeded last year's number.

Among the exhibitors, 95% said they intend to return next year. The employment, trade and industry ministry adds that

questionnaires point to there having been 9.2 (out of ten) general satisfaction with the show among visitors and 9.8 satisfaction with the quality of products on display.

The evaluation was therefore "excellent".

There were 270 exhibitors and

600 boats. As well as the general public, around 300 people applied for a professional pass for the show.

Some 200 members of the media covered the show, with there having been increased interest nationally and internationally.

SHOCK OVER PARIS HOSPITAL BREAK-IN

Paris.—A famous Paris hospital is lodging a legal complaint after dozens of May Day protesters broke in and nearly burst into an intensive care unit. La Pitié-Salpêtrière Hospital director Marie-Anne Ruder said some protesters wore masks and some were yellow-vest activists. Footage on Twitter appeared to show police chasing protesters near the hospital buildings, through an open gate. Ruder said staff blocked protesters at the door of the intensive care unit. Within minutes police reached the unit on the first floor and overpowered the protesters.
