once Britain leaves the European Union.

This will probably be the last time that British residents on the island will be able to vote in the European elections. It could also be the last time that they will be able to vote in the local elections if Britain leaves the European Union without a deal.

British residents have reduced voting rights at the moment and a large proportion of British residents can't vote in the general elections in Britain. Maintaining the local vote is vital so a big turnout is needed.
