## **AMBASSADOR CONFIDENT** BREXIT WILL NOT ISOLATE THE UK FROM SPAIN

MADRID. The British ambassador in Spain, Simon Manley, said yesterday that Brexit will not isolate the UK from import and export trade with Spain and that he is hopeful of an orderly exit with agreements on

"We are a country which believes in free trade and that the open economy is tne strongest and most competitive." The best option, he insisted, is to arrive at a free trade agreement with European partners.

The agreement, he said, will be broad, ambitious and without tariffs, as the UK
