

Spain hopes for swift end to spat

Madrid.—Morocco's ambassador to Madrid warned yesterday if Spain allows the leader of the Western Sahara independence movement to leave Spain without informing Rabat it will worsen the diplomatic crisis between Morocco and Spain.

Brahim Ghali has been treated at a Spanish hospital since April after being diagnosed with COVID-19, a move which angered Morocco and led to Rabat relaxing border controls which allowed thousands of migrants to enter Spain's North African enclave of Ceuta on Monday.

"The other thing that's a big danger, I think, is that some people haven't worked in the hospitality industry for over a year now.
