Pollensa protest over ticket booths

Pollensa.—A petition has been launched by the political group MES Esquerra Pollensa calling on the Pollensa council to order the halt of the construction of six ticket booths in the port. “These are an absolute blot on the landscape. Concrete monstrosities that completely block the beautiful view of the marina and bay. Water not up to scratch in some areas of the island

Palma.—The local ministry for health said that tap water in some areas of the island was not up to standard and it shouldn’t be drunk or used for cooking.

Boffins have pointed to two areas of the island Santanyi and Santa Margalida where tap water has a high level of nitrates.

The local ministry for health said that the whole water system would have to be overhauled to fix the problem.
