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




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MALLORCA TURKEY LOVERS ARE STUFFED

Palm a.—This year's Christmas menus will not include turkeys or ducks from Mallorca because there is no authorised slaughterhouse for them. In mid-November, the Inca farmers' cooperative took over the slaughterhouse in the municipal-

slaughter poultry, but the health ministry prohibited the slaughter of turkeys and ducks.
