

### BIG LIFT OFF FOR SUMMER

Madrid.—Spanish airport operator Aena said earlier this week that airlines using its network have scheduled nearly 8% more seats for this summer than last year, as a rebound in tourism continues since pandemicrelated curbs ended. Airlines have planned 243 million seats at Aena airports - both departures and arrivals - for the summer season from March 31 to October 26, Aena reported.

European airlines have so far registered strong summer advance bookings, keeping a positive outlook for 2024 as they benefit from a continuing post-pandemic travel boom. Aena has increased its seating schedule by more than 10% in the European market from the past summer, boosted by the UK, Germany and Italy.

#### Police arrest three over five deaths

Madrid.—Spanish police have arrested three people over the deaths of five migrants who were deliberately forced off a speedboat last November. The interior ministry says this was just off an Atlantic Ocean beach in Cadiz.

The two men and one woman detained in the Algeciras area about 70 kilometres southeast of Cadiz are accused of forcing the migrants to jump at knife point into the swell with strong currents.
