Palma.—Mallorca-based airline Air Europa is exploring the possibility of operating direct flights to South Africa from Spain with air links to Mallorca, as Palma Airport pushes its boundaries outside Europe.

Air Canada have announced direct flights to Palma from Toronto starting next summer, adding to the weekly seasonal flights from New York.

Etihad Airways will be adding Mediterranean flair to its summer schedule with new seasonal flights to Mallorca from 2026. From 12 June to mid-September 2026, the Abu Dhabi-based carrier will operate three weekly services to the island. This is all fantastic news for the local tour-

ist industry. As one veteran hotelier says: "If there are no flights, there no tourists." The additional services from world international airports is a growing sign that the local tourist industry is becoming more diverse.
