Britons in passport lifeline in Mallorca

Palma.—British dual nationals may be able to fly with Ryanair from Mallorca to Britain even if they do not have a current British passport when new immigration rules come into force next week, the airline has said.

The airline is complying with controversial rules being introduced by the British government but has said that alternative documents that prove a person is a British national may be accepted, according to a report in *The Guardian*.

The development will come as a major relief to many Britons living in Europe

panicked by new Home Office rules that require dual nationals to show a British passport or an electronic travel authorisation (ETA) to board a flight to the UK as part of a streamlining of border operations coming into force on 25 February. The *Bulletin* was contacted by one British father in Mallorca who feared that his children would be denied entry.

Some have had family visits planned while others are worried travel plans may have been scotched by the new rules because children born abroad did not have British passports.

Respected English teacher, author and media pundit held in Palma after husband claims he was poisoned

Palma.—A respected English teacher, author and media pundit was being questioned by Palma police officers yesterday after her husband claimed that he had been poisoned. A full investigation is underway.

According to our sister newspaper, *Ultima Hora*, the woman was detained by police on Wednesday after her husband told officers that he had been poisoned. He allegedly went to a Palma hospital where staff found traces of poison in his blood. He then went to the police and his partner was detained shortly afterwards.

Yesterday evening she was expected to go before a judge in Palma.

Palma police detectives continue to investigate the case and at the moment there are few more details.

The couple had been married for some time and lived in Palma.
