INVEST IN MALLORCA

● Mayor of Palma calls on his British counterparts to spend some cash in the capital as investment drops as a result of Brexit.

Palma.—The Mayor of Palma, Jaime Martinez, has urged his British counterparts, including Manchester Mayor Andy Burnham, to invest in the city. During a meeting in Madrid on Tuesday night, Martinez urged them to bring their business communities to-

gether and look at possible investments in Mallorca.

“British tourism spending has remained high but what we have noticed is that since Brexit, British investment has dropped off. We want to change this,” he told the Bulletin on Wednesday.

Attending the Forum Bloomberg CityLab, apart from the mayors of Palma and Manchester were officials from Liverpool, South Yorkshire and Belfast along with the British ambassador to Spain, Sir Alex Ellis.

The Mayor of Palma underlined

the success of the event and said that it was the first step in what could lead to a close working partnership.

Britain continues to be one of the big investors in Spain with leading British companies all having a sizeable presence in Spain.
