## SAME OLD PROBLEM IN ARENAL

Palma.—The Playa de Palma Hoteliers Association (AHPP) has publicly denounced that the Lluçmajor part of the popular holiday resort of

Arenal is once again facing a critical situation due to the accumulation of rubbish on public streets, with rubbish bins completely overflowing and waste piling up around them for days on end - in the middle of peak season and amid high temperatures. The hoteliers can-

not understand how, after what happened last summer and after the Lluçmajor council itself announced just a few weeks ago an ambitious contract to improve cleaning and waste collection services, the situation has once again deteriorated to absolutely unacceptable levels.
