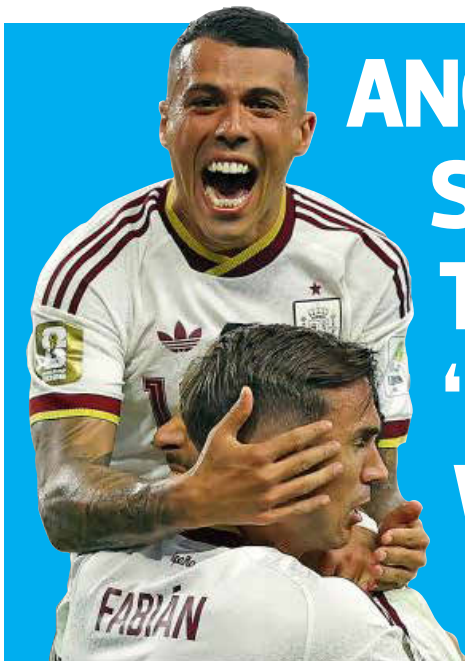

RED ALERT OVER TOURISM PROTEST

Palma.— Tension is mounting ahead of the anti-tourism protest which has been called for July 26 in Palma.

The National Police have opened an investigation into the anti-tourism protest manual produced by Menys Turisme, Més Vida and Arran Mallorca.

The police are analysing if it incites hatred and criminal activity and are seeking to identify those responsible for its compilation.

Police involvement was confirmed on Wednesday by the Spanish Government's Delegation in the Balearics, which said that the state security forces were on the alert to act and

investigate any attacks against tourism interests that may occur during the protest.

And yesterday, the vice-president of the Balearic Government, Antoni Costa, condemned the handbook published by the 'Menys turisme, més vida' platform, describing as "unacceptable" its encouragement of vandalism against shops and tourist establishments. He then demanded that the organisers rectify the situation after an international real estate office in Palma was vandalised on Wednesday night as the protest gathers momentum. **SEE PAGE 12**
