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BRITONS UP, GERMANS DOWN

Palma.—In July, Mallorca attracted 1,983,411 tourists, a fall of 0.5% compared with the same month in 2025. For the whole of the Balearics there were 3,065,811 tourists, which represented a slight increase of 0.2%.

Of the three main tourist markets in Mallorca, Germany was down over five per cent to 542,876, the UK was up 0.6% to 339,616, and Spanish tourism fell three and a half per cent to 209,926. The greatest decrease was French tourism - down over 15% to 108,815. The Benelux countries rose 32% to



156,799. Germany's tourism had risen in both May and June, hinting at a recovery from a slump which started in May last year. In overall terms, July in Mallorca was similar to 2025, when there was also a slight fall in the total number of tourists.

For the Balearic Government, the July performance will probably be taken as vindication of its tourism containment measures, but decreases in Mallorca in July have not been matched for the whole of the Balearics.

There was also a small increase for the Balearics in 2025.
