AIRPORT TAKE OFF



Madrid—Some 34.9 million passengers travelled through Aena's Spanish airports in August, 4.7% more than in the same month last year, the airport operator said.

Growing passenger numbers

highlight Spain's resilience as a tourism hub even as the global airline industry grapples with geopolitical instability, aircraft delivery delays, labour shortages and rising operational costs, which

have constrained capacity growth elsewhere. Passenger numbers in the first eight months of 2026 reached 225.5 million, 4.1% higher than a year ago. Madrid's Adolfo Suarez Barajas remained the busi-

est airport in Spain, followed by Josep Tarradellas Barcelona-El Prat and Palma airport. All airports operated by Aena (in Spain and abroad) saw a rise of 4.7% to 41.4 million passengers in August.
