After all 10 schools participating in the Competition had each taken part in 2 preliminary Debates, the BIG DAY arrived on Tuesday 16 December.

Pupils and teachers were collected from their respective schools early in the morning, all to arrive at PALMA PICTURES. The huge multi-purpose production studio, full of high tech equipment, 4,500 m2, and a height of some 10 meters is seriously impressive. Lighting and sound systems prepared for us, the scene was set for the 2 Final debates to take place.

Volunteers started arriving just after 8.00 in the morning, with a constant stream of students, teachers, sponsors and guests steadily filling the studio.

At 10.00 exactly, the audience of over 180 fell silence, for the Introduction by the Debates Coordinator Kate Mentink, followed by a warm and lively welcome by the Managing

lively welcome by the Managing Director of Palma Pictures and host for the morning, Paul Abrey. The first Debate between **Mal**-

lorca International and San Cayetano was a truly classic debate with excellent exchanges and well prepared presentations.





n San Cayetano school, both Spanish and English-speaking students in their 1st year of Bachillerato have had the chance to participate in the Interschool English debate league over the last few years and it has been a tremendous experience for everyone involved. We are extremely proud of our Spanish students as it is an extra challenge for them in a second language and a fantastic opportunity to improve their English as well as their presentation skills.

But, how does participation in formal debates help our students?

It provides a well-rounded activity where students are able to hone essential skills for life. It can enhance critical thinking skills and allow students to learn how to research information and synthesize it into a coherent and organized argument. During the actual debating, they must be able to communicate effectively, perfecting the art of public speaking and body language, but also develop the skills necessary to actively listen, sometimes an overlooked life skill.



They have enjoyed getting stuck into the challenge of researching their assigned motions and preparing arguments for and against. In their first debate, they argued against the motion: "A higher birth rate is the only way to guarantee western democracy." In the second debate, they argued in support of the motion, "The EU constitution is creating a melting pot of culture."

Our debating team, consisting of Daisy Kemp, Marek Koteja, George Madeley and Lilly Butcher, were thrilled to win both debates and

they're now preparing for the final! King Richard III College has a long history of debating, both in the Key Stage 3 Debate Club and in the 6th form Model United Nations (MUN) enrichment programme. Every year in January, the team travels to Wycombe Abbey School in England to participate in the conference with students from all over the UK.

Debating provides the opportunity to develop so many important skills such as public speaking, speechwriting, rhetoric, strategy, time management and teamwork.

Our team says, "Performing under pressure, with strict

time limits in front of students from other international schools on the island, is what makes this competition so exciting!"





King Richard III College is a privately owned, independent British international school located in Portals Nous, Calvià on the south-west coast of Mallorca. Situated in a quiet residential area by the sea, King Richard III College provides a safe and welcoming learning environment to children from the age of 2 to 18.

The school offers the EYFS curriculum and the English National Curriculum from Year 1 through to IGCSEs and A Levels using the Cambridge and Pearson Edexcel exam boards. King Richard III College is a member of NABSS and authorised by the Spanish ministry of education to offer a parallel Spanish programme, leading to the con-validation of ESO at the end of Year 11 and Título de Bachiller at the end of Year 13.

In the 6th Form, students choose from a range of 18 A Level courses including art, music, economics, PE and psychology. In addition to the three sciences, we also offer marine science which is particularly relevant, given our proximity to the sea and many families' connections with the marine industry.

Our teachers encourage all students to aim high, and our results allow our students to graduate from KR3 to take up places at top universities in Europe, the UK and further afield. In 2024, a quarter of our Year 13 students earned the prestigious Cambridge Outstanding Learner Awards for their A Level exam results

Woven into the ethos of KR3 are the values of empathy and kindness. Through the student council, children are given the opportunity to organise and participate in community events to raise money for charity. In the last two years, our student council has raised over 24,000€ through their events, all of which is donated to the focus charity for each particular year.

KR3 is a small school and intends to remain so. Parents tell us that they particularly value the small class sizes and how well the teachers know and understand their children.
